**Ancient Witness** 

Matthew 25: 31-46

At the appointed time the Promised One will come in glory, escorted by all the angels of heaven, and will sit upon the royal throne, with all the nations assembled below. Then the Promised One will separate them from one another, as shepherd divides the sheep from the goats. The sheep will be placed on the right hand, the goats on the left. The ruler will say to those on the right, "Come, you blessed of God! Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the creation of the world! For I was hungry and you fed me; I was thirsty and you gave me drink. I was a stranger and you welcomed me; naked and you clothed me. I was ill and you comforted me; naked and you clothed me. I was ill and you comforted me; in prison and you came to visit me. Then these just ones will ask, "When did we see you hungry and feed you, or see you thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you as a stranger and invite you in, or clothe you in your nakedness? When did we see you ill or in prison and come to visit you? The ruler will answer them, "The truth is, every time you did this for the least of my sisters or brothers, you did it for me." Then the ruler will say to those on the left, "Out of my sight, you accursed ones! You're good for nothing but the fires of hell. I was hungry and you gave me no food; I was thirsty and you have me nothing to drink. I was a stranger and you gave me no welcome; and naked and you gave me no clothing. I was ill and in prison and you did not come to visit me." Then they in turn will ask, "When did we see you hungry or thirsty, or homeless or naked, or ill or in prison, and not take care of you?" The answer will come, "The truth is, as often as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me." They will go off to eternal doom, and the just will go off to eternal life."
