Two of the disciples, James and John, approached Jesus. "Teacher," they said, "we want you to do something for us."

"What is it?" Jesus asked.

They replied, "See to it that we will be awarded the highest places of honor—one of us at your right, the other at your left—when you come into your glory."

Jesus told them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you capable of drinking the cup I will drink or being baptized in the same baptism I am about to be plunged into?"

"Sure," they replied. Jesus said in response, "From the cup I drink of, you will drink; the baptism I am immersed in, you will share. But as to awarding places of honor, that is not mine to give. There are other arrangements for that"

When the other ten disciples heard this conversation, they lost their tempers at James and John. Jesus called them together and said, "You know how among the Romans those who exercise authority are domineering and arrogant. Those 'great ones' know how to make their own importance felt.
