# Connecting with Sacred Stories

Ancient Witness	John 12:1-8 [Inclusive]Jann Hill

Six days before Passover, Jesus went to Bethany, the village of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. There they gave a banquet in Jesus’ honor, at which Martha served. Lazarus was one of those who were present at the table. Mary brought over a pound of costly ointment, made of pure nard, and anointed the feet of Jesus, wiping them with her hair. The house was full of the scent of the [costly] perfume.

Judas Iscariot, one of the disciples — the one who was to betray Jesus — protested, “Why wasn’t this perfume sold? It could have brought nearly a year’s wages, and the money could have been given to the poor!” Judas did not say this out of concern for the poor, but because he was a thief. He was in charge of the common fund and would help himself to it.

So Jesus replied, “Leave her alone. She did this in preparation for my burial. You have poor people with you always. But you won’t always have me.”
